

English in Use – Junior Camps

Program Description

This English in Use course is designed for young learners aged 6 to 12 and aims to help students develop and strengthen their English skills in a meaningful and memorable way. Using engaging content and real-world themes, the course supports learners in building a strong foundation in the four core language skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing. In addition to language development, students are encouraged to explore the world around them, fostering curiosity, critical thinking, and global awareness.

Admission Requirements

Students will be placed in the appropriate level by taking the VGC Camp placement test.

Program Duration and Structure

The English in Use course is the morning component of the junior program. Classes take place five times a week (Monday – Friday) for 80 minutes a day. Every unit of the textbook provides authentic content from around the world to foster collaboration, creativity and cultural awareness. Students can start in any week as each week starts with a separate unit.

Homework Expectations

Homework may be given for the class.

Attendance Expectations

Students are expected to attend all of their classes.

Assessment

While there is no formal grade for this course, students are continually assessed by and given feedback from their teacher.

Expressions and Conversation – Junior Camps

Program Description

Expressions and Conversation is designed to help students further develop and practice their speaking skills, fluency, useful and practical expressions as well as error corrections to enhance communicative abilities.

Admission Requirements

Students will be placed in the appropriate level by taking our VGC placement test.

Assigned Text(s)

This course uses a range of texts and authentic materials. All materials will be provided for students to keep in their binder.

Program Duration and Structure

The Expressions and Conversation course is the afternoon component of the teen program. Classes are held three times a week for 80 minutes and cover various topics that lead to authentic conversation. Students can start the course in any week, as each week is a self-contained unit.

Homework Expectations

Homework may be given for the class.

Attendance Expectations

Students are expected to attend all of their classes.

Assessment

While there is no formal grade for this course, students are continually assessed by and given feedback from their teacher.

English Skills and Vocabulary – Junior Camps

Program Description

English Skills and Vocabulary for Life is designed to help our students further develop their language skills. Our students will continue strengthening the foundations of their skills practicing their language skills and vocabulary in a meaningful and interactive way.

Admission Requirements

Students will be placed in the appropriate level by taking our VGC placement test.

Assigned Text(s)

This course uses a range of texts and authentic materials. All materials will be provided for students to keep in their binder.

Program Duration and Structure

The English Skills and Vocabulary for Life is the afternoon component of the junior camp program. Classes take place three times a week for 80 minutes a day and consist of weekly guided language lessons and real word stories. Students can start the course in any week as each week is a self-contained unit.

Homework Expectations

Homework may be given for the class.

English Through Canadian Culture – Junior Camps

Program Description

Program Duration and Structure

The Canadian Culture course is the morning component of the junior camp program. Classes take place five times a week for 90 minutes a day and comprise weekly guided lessons that will prepare students for the applied English activity.

Homework Expectations

Homework may be given for the class.

Attendance Expectations

Students are expected to attend all of their classes.

Assessment

While there is no formal grade for this course, students are continually assessed by and given feedback from their teacher.
